

# Garden Highlights, December 2017

This month we highlight some plants from Africa.

1. Many species of ***Pelargonium*** come from southern Africa. The plants that are commonly called Geraniums, have the botanical name *Pelargonium*. Plants covered with blooms are on display in the Pelargonium House. Don't miss the nearby beds that display various species of *Pelargonium* with numerous smaller flower heads. In the 21st Century garden there is a small collection of deciduous *Pelargoniums*, with small flowers, from dry areas of Africa.

2. The **Forest Bell *Mackaya bella***, from the summer rainfall evergreen forests of southern Africa grows well in deep shade.

3. The large tree in the centre of oldest part of these gardens is an **African Coral Tree *Erythrina caffra***. Coming from the east coast of southern Africa, where rain falls in summer, it sheds its leaves in the cool weather and has a lush cloak of leaves in summer. Its red pea flowers often appear before the leaves, but may also open when leaves are present. There are examples of smaller species of *Erythrina* in the garden beds nearby. They do not all flower at the same time.

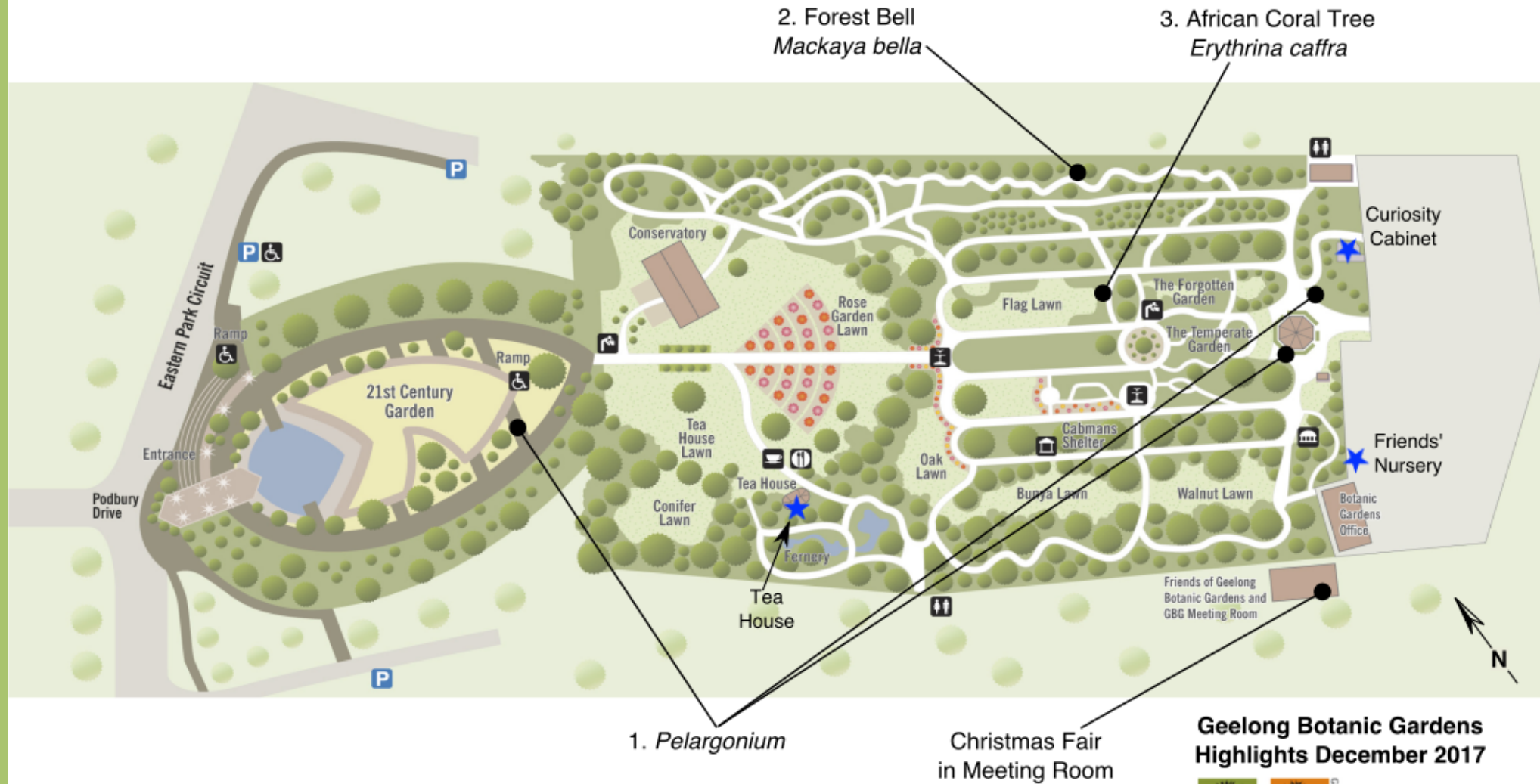
Over page: Map showing plant locations
