After a season with good rain, flowers are responding to the warmer days of summer. Four special collections of plants are flowering in profusion this month.

1. Commonly called **Geraniums**, the **Pelargoniums** in the Pelargonium House are covered with blooms. Don't miss the nearby beds that display Pelargonium species plants with flowers that look more delicate.
2. The terraces of the **Herb Garden** are lush. The herbs are displaying more subtle flowers, but of course we value herbs for their aroma and taste. In the top terrace the **Nasturtiums Tropaeolum** are boldly showing their orange flowers with a spur at the back. Nasturtiums have been used in salads, but some people find the spicy aroma a bit strong, hence the name Nasturtium meaning "nose-tweaker"
3. The **Perennial Border**, with some 60 species of plants, is a riot of flower colours in December and January. Don't forget to look beyond the colourful flowers to those of the taller grasses and rushes forming diverse graceful shapes.
4. Many plants in the **Salvia** collection flower in summer. They are in several beds in the middle of the lower garden area.

The Tea House is open every day.

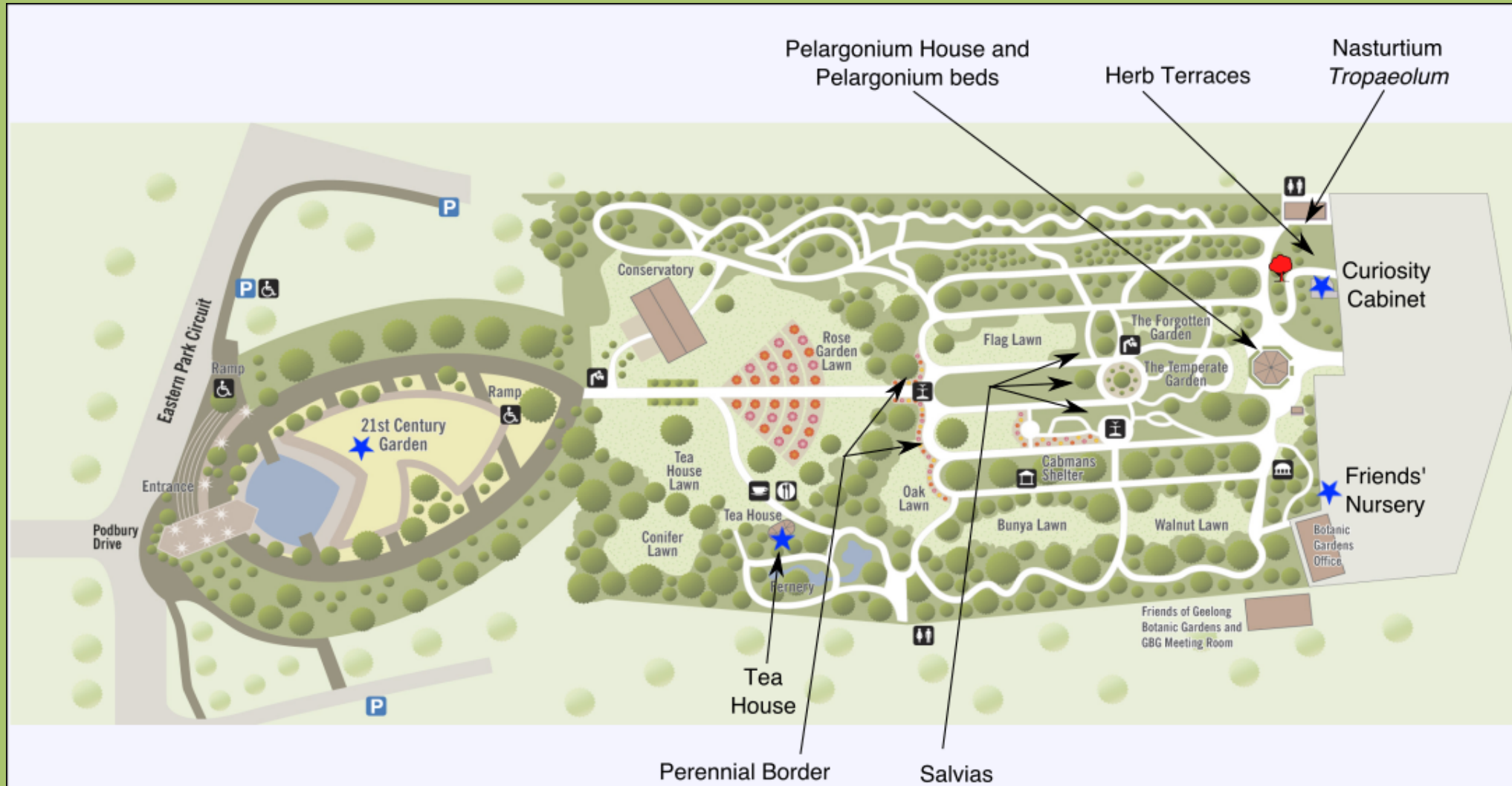


Over page: Map showing these plants and beds
